RECORDING PRESENTATIONS

There are *many* options to **record a video** for a Canvas assignment or discussion. Following are just three tools that can be used for **individual or group presentations**.

PowerPoint with Video

Use the *Cameo* feature within PowerPoint. Students record themselves *within* PowerPoint, then convert to a video and upload to Canvas.

PowerPoint with Voice Narration

Record voiceover on each slide then convert to a video and upload to Canvas.

Zoom

Use your free Zoom account and start a meeting, share your screen to show the slide deck, turn on the video and sound, record your "meeting/presentation" and then download the recording and upload to Canvas.

Canva

This tool provides free accounts and students can create slide decks, infographics, other types of media, and a presentation to record video on slide decks.

COURSE NAVIGATION

Your **course menu** will contain the following items:

- [Announcements](#): When your instructors posts the first announcement, you will gain access to view this menu item. Check for important information throughout the course.
- [Syllabus](#): Includes a downloadable file of the course syllabus and a course summary of due dates.
- [Modules](#): Displays weekly learning materials, engagement opportunities, and assessments.
- [Assignments](#) Displays course assessments only. These can also be accessed from the Modules page.
- [People](#): Displays all the users in your course and access to student groups (*if applicable*).
- [Grades](#): You can also view grades earned, instructor feedback, rubrics, and make private comments to your instructor on grading.
